- Luke 2:7

At this time of year when we are busy wrapping our gifts and decorating and entertaining, we tend to put aside the most important gift that we can receive. We see all the expensive gifts and decorations and busyness, but we overlook the simple life-changing gift that is priceless and free.

When Christ came to us, he came as a defenseless infant, born of poor parents in very modest circumstances. We pay more attention to great fanfare events, celebrity appearances and royal weddings. We don't take time to make room in our lives for the blessings that come disguised and wrapped in simple cloths.

How full is your inn? Have you filled all your rooms with the things that break, rust, dent or spoil? How many of the gifts that you received last year do you remember? What would it take to refocus your attention on the eternal instead of the temporal?

Revelation 3:20 "Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with him, and he with me."

Jesus is standing at your door. He is knocking. He is waiting for you to open your door to Him so that He can come in. He wants you to make room at your inn so that He can fill you with blessings, satisfy your hunger, and heal your broken places. Make room in your inn for the Prince of Peace, the Wonderful Counselor. He has been patient with us for a very long time. He is waiting for us to make a place for Him in our hearts and minds and lives.

Make this the year that you receive the greatest gift that will not be forgotten. This gift is an ongoing gift. It is new every morning and never loses its value. It is free but it is also priceless. Receive the gift and the Giver. Spend an eternity celebrating with the One who loves us enough to come to an inn that has no room. He knocks and patiently waits for us to open the door. 
